Coronavirus Update

I hope this finds you and your family safe and well and trust that you are coping during the lockdown. The 'Beast From The East' seems to be the next challenge facing us although that does seem, at least, to have an end in sight!

In school our Keyworker Provision continues to be busy - thank you to all parents and carers who are ensuring that we have accurate lists for safeguarding and staffing purposes by booking in using the link which is emailed weekly. If you believe that your child requires a place in this provision, please email news@gps.hlt.academy in the first instance so that we can respond to your query. In line with DfE guidance, school is **closed** over the half term break, closing on **Friday 12 February** and the provision will reopen on **Monday 22 February**.

We are pleased with the number of students who are now engaging in online learning through the Google Classroom platform on an hourly and daily basis. Wherever possible, students should aim to follow their school timetable as this will give the best access to teaching staff through live lessons, lessons in the Google Stream and support for any queries. I understand that on occasions students may need to catch up with a lesson at a later date and live lessons particularly can be difficult to recapture after the event. Therefore, a new consent form for live lessons has been produced and I would be delighted if you could fill this in immediately:

The new consent form allows teachers to upload recordings of the lesson to the Google Classroom so that students who have to miss a lesson are able to watch the recording later. Where a teacher has requested it, this also allows students to turn their cameras on which is incredibly useful for some practical subjects. Your help in completing this form quickly would be appreciated.

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As part of the Department for Education's strategy for remote education, we have begun to issue weekly tracking of your child's engagement in online learning; I hope you have received our initial emails and that you are finding these useful. My own child is in Year 7 and I know that when we get emails from his school about incomplete or missing work, it helps us have an informed conversation about what might have gone wrong. On many occasions, as we all get to grips with new technology, a task might have been handed in using the wrong format or, most often, not submitted after completion.
